

## STATEMENT OF REPRESENTATION PROCEDURE

### Town and Country (Local Planning) (England) (Regulations 2012) – Regulations 19, 20 & 35 The Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004

**Title of document** - A Local Plan for Sefton

**Subject matter and area covered** - The Sefton Local Plan sets out the Council's planning strategy for the development of the whole of the Sefton Council borough over the next 15 years and includes sites identified for development. The Local Plan includes priorities for regeneration and investment. It will include policies to guide development in the borough, and be used in the consideration of future planning applications.

**Representation period** - Representations can be made over an eight week consultation period starting Friday 30<sup>th</sup> January 2015 and ending on Friday March 27<sup>th</sup> 2015.
