

According to the Sefton Historic Settlement Study (2011, 5-6) a prehistoric axehead and a flint core were discovered in a ploughed field led to an archaeological evaluation in 2004 by Oxford Archaeology North, near the eastern boundary of Aintree township close to where the canal crosses the River Alt. This evaluation identified three undated pits and sherds of post-medieval pottery and glass.





