Last summer, the Council ran a public climate consultation where we gathered residents' views and opinions on the climate emergency and the Council's work.

A key takeaway was the desire for more information sharing on what the Council is doing, how residents can save energy at home, and how we can reduce our carbon footprint.

And so we have created our first climate-specific email newsletter! The newsletters will be shared quarterly, with the next edition coming in January 2024.

What is 'Climate Change'?

Climate change is the term to describe the long-term shifts in weather patterns and temperatures.

Since the mid-1800s, humans have contributed to the release of carbon dioxide and other greenhouse gases into the air. This causes global temperatures to rise, resulting in long-term changes to the climate.

What is the Council doing?

In July 2019 Sefton Council declared a Climate Emergency. In declaring a Climate Emergency, it was agreed the Council is committed to reducing carbon emissions and resolves to go further than the UK100 Agreement (<u>learn more about this here</u>).

The Council also agreed to act in line with the scientific consensus that we must reduce emissions to net zero

by 2030, and therefore commits to:

- Make the Council's activities net-zero carbon by 2030
- Ensure that all strategic decisions are in line with a shift to zero carbon by 2030
- Achieve 100% clean energy across Sefton Council's full range of functions by 2030

Climate Emergency Annual Report 2022-23

The Council have shared the latest annual report for 2022-23 which highlights the progress made towards our ambitious net zero 2030 target.

The document reports that:

- Emissions have reduced by 748 tonnes (7%) in the last vear
- Since 2019, there has been a 2,036 tonne reduction in emissions, which is a 18% decrease
- As of April 2023, all electricity used by the Council is now generated from 100% renewable sources
- **3,000 school children** received climate related education from the teaching team at the Eco Centre in Southport
- Over 200 homes in the borough had energy-saving solar panels and battery storage installed, thanks to the Liverpool City Region's Solar Together project
- Several domestic retrofit programmes were delivered across the region which increased the energy efficiency of local homes and helped residents save money on heating bills

While we are proud of what has been achieved so far, we recognise there is still a long way to go.

Solar Together is back!

The Liverpool City Region project, Solar Together, is back for residents in Sefton.

Launched in 2022, the scheme aims to help home-owners to buy solar panels and battery storage at lower prices, helping to cut energy costs while also reducing carbon emissions.

There is also an option to have electric vehicle charging points fitted.

Over 400 people came along to the event, ran by social enterprise Regenerus, which was hosted at Salt and Tar, Bootle Canalside.


