CHAT TEAM: 0151 934 4013 If you are worried about a child or young person and think they may be at risk of neglect or harm.

FAST TEAM: 0151 934 4545 if you or a family you work with need support from the Early Help Service.

EMERGENCY DUTY TEAM: 0151 934 3555 outside of working hours, weekends and bank holidays.
