

Climate Emergency Annual Report 2023-24



The Council has published its fourth Climate Emergency Annual Report documenting the work and progress made towards the Council's ambitious net zero 2030 target.

Since 2019, when the Council began to track its emissions, there has been a 4,701 tonne reduction in total emissions, which represents a 41% decrease.

Emissions have continued to reduce every year with 2023-24 achieving a reduction of 29%, almost double the previous year's decrease.

Salt and Tar Sustainable Values



Salt and Tar is a multi use outdoor event venue on Bootle's canal side. Through the delivery of events, culture, music and art, it is striving to be the key catalyst to the town's wider regeneration project symbolising change and hope for the community.

The venue aims to incorporate sustainable values into how they operate.

So far, Salt and Tar have established the below list of processes and ways of working while continuing to seek sustainable options across all operations.

- Introduced an onsite compost for naturally fuelling the urban planters
- Bunting decoration used at the venue was hand sewn by In Another Place volunteers and created from second hand materials
- Prioritised social value as a key factor when procuring contractors to ensure all staff are local and use public transport where possible such as Logika Security, Sound City, Event Cntl, Big Comedy UK
- Local supply chain encouraged by using local food and drink traders and market makers
- Waste management managed by Sefton Council's in house cleansing team recycling waste where possible
- Promoting the great public transport connections for visitors to get to Salt and Tar and working with Merseyrail to support us on social media campaign

Public Sector Decarbonisation Scheme

The Public Sector Decarbonisation Scheme is Government-led and provides grants for public sector bodies to fund heat decarbonisation and energy efficiency measures.

The Liverpool City Region (LCR) has secured funding which will allow two buildings in Sefton to benefit from the scheme.

The chosen huildings for decarbonisation will have the gas

boilers removed and replaced with low carbon heat pumps and additional insulation will be installed.

Further information will become available as the scheme progresses over the next year.

Free Trees for Schools and Communities



The Woodland Trust is giving away hundreds of thousands of trees to UK schools and communities.

Applicants are able to apply for the following tree packs: hedge, copse, wild harvest, year-round colour, working wood, wild wood, wildlife and urban trees.

The scheme is currently taking applications for tree packs to be delivered in March 2025.
